Art must be original and depict only the Turtle, Wolf and Bear clans and the Oneida belt Art should be submitted in digital format as PDF or EPS, or an original drawing or painting, no larger than 11 x 17 Design must include the words "Oneida Indian Nation Elders" Design area is the side of the bus and above windshield and should be horizontal format. 1 submission per person Include with your submission: your name, email address, phone number, mailing address, copy of your tribal enrollment card and a brief biography. ONEIDA INDIAN NATION ELDERS BUS DESIGN CONCEPT CONTEST

NO PURCHASE NECESSARY TO ENTER OR WIN. BY PARTICIPATING, YOU AGREE TO THESE RULES.

The Oneida Indian Nation Elders are sponsoring a contest for a distinctive design that will adorn the side of their bus. The contest begins Feb. 3, 2020 and will end 5:00 p.m. June 22, 2020.

1. Eligibility. Participation is open to enrolled members of any officially recognized Indian tribe. There is no age limit, but participants under the age of 18 will require the signature of a parent or guardian in connection with entering the contest or claiming any prize. All participants must provide a copy of his/her tribal enrollment card with his/her entry submission. Oneida Indian Nation Elders who serve as contest judges are ineligible to enter the contest.

2. How to Enter. To enter, eligible participants must submit a design concept for the side of the Oneida Indian Nation Elders bus, an approximately 6' x 1.5' space, by email to <u>tpatterson@oneida-nation.org</u> no later than 5:00 p.m. on June 22, 2020 or by mail, postmarked no later than June 22, 2020, to Ray Elm Children & Elders Center, 5000 Skenondoa Way, Oneida, NY 13421. The contest entry must include original art work that depicts just the Turtle, Bear and Wolf clans and the Oneida belt, and contains the words "Oneida Indian Nation Elders." Submitted art work must be in digital format as a PDF or EPS or as an original drawing or painting no larger than 11" X 17." All submissions must be accompanied by a the participant's name, email address, phone number, mailing address and brief biography. Failure to provide any of this information or to abide by any of these specifications will result in a void contest entry. The Oneida Indian Nation is not responsible for incorrect, illegible or missing information with respect to contest entries. Limit of one entry per participant for the contest.

3. Prize. There is a Five Hundred Dollar (\$500) prize for this contest, which will be provided in the form of a check. All prizes awarded during this promotion are non-negotiable and non-transferrable.

4. Winning a Prize. The winner of the contest prize will be determined by a majority vote of a committee of the Oneida Indian Nation Elders by June 27, 2020. The judges will consider the full composition of the entry and how it fulfils the contest design requirements in selecting a winner. The decision of the Oneida Indian Nation Elders will be final. In case of a tie, the Elders will vote again until a winner is chosen.

5. Claiming Prize(s). The Oneida Indian Nation Elders will notify the winner by email using the email address provided with the winning submission. The winner will be required to sign a form that acknowledges that the design is original and that the Oneida Indian Nation is the sole owner of the submitted design as a condition to claiming a prize. The Oneida Indian Nation Elders will mail the prize to the address provided with the winning submission within 10 days of receiving the Winner Release form.

6. Release. The Oneida Indian Nation, including the Elders program, and its members and affiliates shall not be liable for any injury or other harm related to or resulting from participating in this contest, or claiming or using any prize.

7. Voluntary Participation. Participation is voluntary. By participating in this contest and accepting any prize, each participant grants the Oneida Indian Nation permission to use his/her name, picture/likeness, address (city and state), biographical information, voice recording and any statements made by such participant regarding the contest or its other programs and activities and/or for promotional or publicity purposes without notice, further permission or compensation.

8. **Right to Cancel; Disqualification.** The Oneida Indian Nation Elders reserve the right to cancel this promotion at any time. Participants who do not comply with these Rules, or attempt to interfere or tamper with this contest in any way, will be disqualified. If it is determined that the winning design is not an original design, the winner shall be required to forfeit, and/or immediately return the prize to the Oneida Indian Nation Elders.
